

SHELTER NOTES

May 2018 saw an increase in the number of Euthanasia's. This was in most part due to the months of April and May being breeding season for Cats and Dogs that have not been spayed or neutered. Most of our intakes were the result of uncontrolled breeding in the area.

However, our euthanasia numbers did decrease almost 20% from this time last year, large part being our hard work at transferring animals out to rescues, fostering, as well as increased enrichment with our animals.
