

South Guthrie Community Center



Project Description:

This historic Warfield schoolhouse building was built in 1922 with 2 classrooms. The schoolhouse was used until Montgomery County consolidated and integrated its schools with the City of Clarksville. In the late 1970's, a federal grant helped renovate the building into a community center. This renovation "modernized" the structure to a point that it was no longer eligible to be listed on the Register of Historic Places. With the new renovation, one room has been set up as a classroom/museum for historical preservation. Lyle Cook Martin Architects received a Citation Award through the American Institute of Architects Design Awards. The building was originally 2,000 sq. ft. and now boasts 3,920 sq. ft.
